David Francisco McKenna Harriman



On September 24th American Idol contestant and spinal cord injury survivor David Francisco paid a visit to Machias Memorial High School to tell his story. The Maine Bureau of Highway Safety and Choices Matter, a program that brings speakers to schools, sponsored his visit and had activities for students to participate in after David's talk.

In April of 2016, David moved to Nashville to pursue his ambitions in music. Not long after the move, he was riding his bicycle and was involved in a crash. The driver, who was distracted and impaired, ran a red light and hit David's left side. His bike was completely bent out of shape, and the left side pedal was sheared off. David was paralyzed from the waist down and was unsure if he would walk again. David spent eight months doing rehabilitation at the Shepherd Center in Atlanta, Georgia. After a hard-fought battle to regain his mobility, he was able to return to school in January of 2017.

David graduated from The Blackbird Academy for audio engineering in June of 2017, and very soon after, he proposed to his now wife, Kristi. In March of 2018 he auditioned for

American Idol. In this audition he told his story and made Katy Perry cry. In June of 2018 David and his wife made an appearance on the Ellen Show.

David and the driver that hit him have become friends, and she even attended David and Kristi's wedding. The driver had a drug issue at the time of the crash; she has since turned her life around and is now completely sober. Her story, combined with David's, shows the power of forgiveness. David's overall message is that it's up to you to make good of whatever happens to you. You can either grow from your struggles, or you can be stuck in the victim mindset. David is currently working on an album that will come out November 1st. He is also working on a book that he hopes will be released in January of 2020.

To compliment David's story, the Maine Bureau of Highway Safety and Choices Matter provided a few different simulations, including a drunk driving simulator and drunk goggles to try. Students left the assembly with some powerful feelings regarding the importance of the choices they make, both in terms of impact on others and on themselves.
